# **Industry as a Growth Driver**

- Industry is the driver of innovation and growth in Austria,
  - ...accounting directly and indirectly for up to 60% of the country's value added,
  - ...exporting goods worth EUR 12.600 per inhabitant per year,
  - ...securing two out or three workplaces in the country,
  - ... pays 61 percent of the domestic expenditures for research and development.



### IV in Brief

- The Federation of Austrian Industries (IV) is a voluntary body representing the interests of about 4.200 members
  - It is our goal to represent the interests of our members in Austria and at the European level in a targeted and sustainable manner.
- The structure of IV is based on office-holders serving on a voluntary basis as well as staff in paid employment.
  - Nine Regional Groups, the Federal Organisation and the Brussels office provide a broad range of services for our members.



# **IV** – History

- **1862:** Foundation of the "Association of Industrialists" as the first supra-regional body representing the interests of industry in Austria
- 1911: Construction of the "House of Industry" in Vienna
- 1946: Constituent Assembly of the "Federation of Austrian Industrialists"
- **1986: Accession to UNICE** (now BUSINESSEUROPE), the Brussels-based Confederation of European Business



# IV – Today

- Top-level contacts with politicians and opinion-makers enable IV to effectively represent the interests of its members.
- Long-standing tradition of co-operation with the social partners in Austria and Europe.
- Broad-based network supporting IV in its work on specific topics.



# IV in Europe

- Industry pioneered the cause of Austria's integration into the EU.
- As early as 1988, IV was the first Austrian association to open an office in Brussels.
- Today, IV's Brussels office serves as
  - an interface to the European institutions and
  - a communication and lobbying platform between the national and the European level



## IV in Europe

- IV is the Austrian member of BUSINESSEUROPE, the Confederation of European Business.
- BUSINESSEUROPE represents
  - over 20 million small, medium-sized and large enterprises
  - grouped in 40 associations from 34 countries
  - Social Partners in the European Social Dialogue
- Through our input to the organisation's work programme, our interests and concerns are well represented at the European level.



# IV in Europe

- Within the framework of the informal Central European Group, IV co-operates closely with its sister associations in the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Slovenia, Hungary, Croatia, Bulgaria and Romania on central topics, such as
  - labour-market policy,
  - infrastructure and
  - energy policy.

## IV International

- IV is a member of BIAC (Business and Industry Advisory Committee of the OECD)
  - Established in 1962 as an independent organisation, BIAC is the official body representing the interests of the OECD business community.
  - The BIAC membership comprises the major employer organisations of 31 OECD Member States – representing the interests of over 8 million enterprises.

## IV International

IV is also a member of IOE (International Organisation of Employers), an international organisation founded in 1920.

- IOE represents the interests of employers, above all in matters of labour and social policy, in international organisations, such as ILO (International Labour Organisation)
- Currently, IOE comprises 147 national employer associations from 140 countries of the world.



## IV International

- IV is a member of the Istanbul-based UBCCE (Union of Black Sea and Caspian Confederation of Enterprises).
  - Currently, UBCCE has 22 member associations, all of them voluntary national bodies representing the interests of the business communities of 17 countries
  - bordering the Black Sea or the Caspian Sea and/or maintaining close relations with the region
